 deceased left in administration by  
 Susanna Dacres Spinster the  
 Sister of the said deceased and  
 surviving Executor named in the  
 said Will. was also deceased  
 was granted to George Dacres  
 Esq. the Administration with  
 the Will annexed of the Goods  
 Chattels and Credits of the said  
 Dacres deceased for that John  
 Mordaunt the other Executor named  
 in the said Will died in the  
 life time of the said Elizabeth  
 having been first sworn duly  
 to administer

**I John Mordaunt of** Stansted  
 Abbot in Hertfordshire County do make this my last Will & give  
 five pounds to the poor whereof one third part thereof is for the  
 poor of Stansted aforesaid and all the rest is for the poor of the  
 Parish of North in Hertfordshire to be paid in one Month after  
 my death & give to my Brother Charles Mordaunt and to his  
 two Daughters my Sister King my Sister Dyle and to every one of  
 his Sons and Daughters and also to the Son and Daughter of  
 my deceased Brother Lewis Mordaunt a Guinea apiece to every  
 one of them and to be paid in two Months after my death &  
 forgive my Brother in Law James Dyle the ten Guineas which  
 he owes me & give to my said Sister Dyle all my Great Linen  
 being Shirts Pillowcases Table Linen and Towels & give to my  
 God Son George Dyle two Suits of Cloaths my Cloath riding Coat  
 and Buck skin Boots and two of my best Wiggs & give to  
 my Son John Mordaunt all such Lands as I purchased as he  
 only between his intailed Lands for to make his handsome parts  
 but all other my purchased Lands whatsoever & give unto my  
 Daughter Elizabeth Wife of Robert Audley Britain Clerk  
 and her heirs & give to my said Son John Mordaunt all my  
 Household Goods as I have at Ever Calvert and I also give  
 him all my Law Books & writings and papers about the  
 Law all the Rest of my Books my silver Tankard Escripion  
 and Writing Desk & give to my Grand Son Robert Audley  
 Britain & give to my Grand Daughter Mary Mordaunt my  
 large silver Cup and the Cover to it at his age of one and  
 twenty years all the Rest of my personal Estate whatsoever  
 after all my Debts funeral Charges are paid & give to my  
 said Daughter Elizabeth Wife of the said Robert Audley  
 Britain and do make her sole Executrix and revoke all  
 other Wills by me formerly made Given under my hand and  
 Seal this ninth day of May Anno Domini 1728. In Mordaunt

 Yeoman being sick and weak in body but of sound and  
 disposing Mind and understanding Thanks be given to  
 Almighty God for the same do make and ordain this my last  
 Will and Testament in manner following that is to say I first  
 give my soul into the hands of my Creator and my Body  
 to remain to the Earth to be decently buried and as to my  
 worldly Estate I give and dispose of as followeth I give  
 give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Medhurst the sum  
 of ffewscore pounds to be paid her at her age of twenty one  
 years or day of Marriage which first happens and the interest  
 hereof I order shall be yearly applyed towards her maintenance  
 and bringing up I give unto my loving Wife Anne one quinea  
 as a Token of my love to her and desire her to take care of  
 bringing up my Children also I order and desire that all my  
 debts and Debtyes be justly and faithfully paid and after the  
 same are so discharged all the Rest and residue of my  
 Goods Chattels Stock and personall Estate whatsoever other  
 wheresoever except my Debt which I give to my eldest  
 son Thomas for him to wear when he is at age and not before  
 I give devise and bequeath unto my three sons Thomas John  
 and William to be equally shared between them or the value  
 hereof also I order and appoint my said loving Wife Anne  
 and son Thomas joint Executors in Trust and for the uses  
 aforesaid of this my Will and do desire make and appoint my  
 two loving Brothers John Medhurst and John Piquett  
 Trustees and Overseers hereof and do give each of them a  
 Ring of a Quinea value in Remembrance of me in witness  
 whereof I the said William Medhurst have to this my last  
 Will and Testament contained in one sheet of paper set my  
 hand and seal to each sheet the twentieth third day of November  
 in the third year of King George the second Annoq; Domini  
 1724. William Medhurst signed sealed published and declared  
 in the presence of us who subscribed our names as Witnesses  
 hereunto in the Testators presence and at his request William  
 de la Roche Jean de la Roche Fran. Green
