 Testatrix having been first sworn duly to administer

 Mordaunt the whole of my property whatsoever
 and wheresoever for the benefit of my poor children
 vizt Elizabeth Mordaunt Charles Mordaunt John
 Mordaunt and George Mordaunt the Interest and
 so much of the principal as shall be found
 necessary to be appropriated towards the Education
 and bringing up my said children the Remainder
 of the principal to be divided between my poor
 children Elizabeth Mordaunt Charles Mordaunt John

Mordant and George Mordant equally share and a
share alike as they shall attain the age of twenty one
years and in case one or more of them dies before
they attain the age of twenty one years their share
or shares to go to the survivor or survivors and

John Henry Douglas of the East India Company
his office Graydon Square in the Strand in the
County of Middlesex Gentlemen and made Oath
that he knew and was well acquainted with Ever-
Mordant late of Portsmouth in the County of Surrey
deceased for a great many years before and to the
time of his death and during such time that he
frequently saw him write and subscribe his name
to writings and that he thereby became well acquainted
with his manner and character of handwriting and
subscription and having now carefully viewed and
inspected the paper writing therein supposed purporting
to be the last Will and Testament of the said
deceased the same beginning thus "In the name of
God Amen I Ever Mordant of the East India
Company London being weak in body" and ending thus
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this seventh day of March 1807 and thus
subscribed Ever Mordant this Deponent saith ac-
cordingly and in his conscience believes the name
Ever Mordant so subscribed to the said Will to be
of the proper handwriting and subscription of the
said Ever Mordant deceased - J. H. Douglas - Same
day the said John Henry Douglas was duly sworn
to the truth of this affidavit before me - J. Person
Esq. present - J. Mordant - Prof. Pub.

be paid the rest residue and remainder of the said
sum of Three hundred and fifty pounds stock
unto my three dear Sisters Grace Mason Catherine
Catherine Glendinning wife of the said William
Glendinning and Mary Elizabeth True wife of William
True of Bow Street Lane Market in the said County
of Middlesex and to make or cause to be made in
the same like proportions the said property whosoever
Real or personal which I may be so become intitled
to or possess at the time of my decease in three
proportions share and share alike the same to be
paid unto my said three Sisters Grace Mason Catherine
Glendinning and Mary Elizabeth True six parts
after my decease and I appoint and constitute my
said Brother in Law William Glendinning my Sole
Executor to this my last Will and Testament written
on three sides of paper and signed or marked by my
mark on the first and second sides and signed or
marked by my mark and sealed with my seal on
the third and last side hereof in the presence of three
true and lawful witnesses whose names are hereunto
subscribed as attesting the execution of the same
this fourth day of February in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eight Thomas Mason
