# The last Will & Testament of Jenny Mordaunt

of my said Jenny Mordaunt now of London  
 London, I do hereby make as follows I give to my  
 Sister Sarah my widow and to my Brother  
 William Mordaunt and ever Mordaunt the  
 sum of twenty pounds a piece I give to my Sister  
 Sophia Mordaunt the daughter of my said  
 Brother William Mordaunt the sum of twenty  
 pounds I give to my Brother Charles Mordaunt  
 the son of my said Brother ever Mordaunt  
 the like sum of twenty pounds also I give to  
 my friend James Ball of Tower Street Jeweler  
 the sum of five pounds for a Ring all the residue of my  
 property as well what I am or may be possessed  
 with under the will of Henry my deceased  
 or otherwise be the same of what nature or in  
 kind soever and which I have power to dispose  
 of subject to the payment of my debts funeral  
 and testamentary expenses I give to my Brother  
 George Mordaunt for his own absolute use and  
 benefit if he shall be living at my decease but  
 in case of his death in my life time I give all  
 such the residue of my property equally between  
 George Mordaunt Dorothy Mordaunt and James  
 Mordaunt the son and daughter of my said  
 Brother George Mordaunt by his first wife if  
 all living at my decease and in case of the death  
 of any one of them in my life time the said  
 residue of my property to go to and be equally  
 divided between the two survivors and also if it  
 happens that two of them dies in my life time  
 I give the whole of the said residue to survivor  
 of them the said George Mordaunt the son  
 Dorothy Mordaunt and James Mordaunt as  
 may be living at my decease I appoint my  
 said Brother George Mordaunt George  
 Mordaunt his son and Joan Mordaunt of  
 Bartons Surgeon Executors of this my will  
 which I declare to be my last and which  
 revoke all former wills in witness whereof I have  
 said James Mordaunt have hereunto set my  
 hand and seal this twentieth fourth day of October  
 one thousand eight hundred and four Jenny  
 Mordaunt (Jus) Signed Sealed published and  
 declared by the said James Mordaunt as and  
 for his last will and testament in the presence  
 of us who in his presence at his request and  
 in the presence of each other have subscribed  
 our names as witnesses to the said signature  
 thereof George Shepherd H. In Hogarth St. Alder  
 St. Dun.



On the 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1855  
 the main will of the late George  
 Mordaunt of the County of Middlesex  
 and his children of Henry Mordaunt  
 formerly of Leadenhall Street  
 London but late of Clackney  
 in the County of Middlesex  
 deceased left testamentary  
 by George Mordaunt the  
 brother of the deceased  
 and the Mordaunt Legatee  
 named in the said will  
 I desire that the said  
 will be proved and  
 granted to Frederick  
 Mordaunt  
 the son and one of the  
 surviving legatees of the  
 will of the said George  
 Mordaunt deceased having  
 been first sworn duly  
 to administer George  
 Mordaunt the younger  
 and John Mordaunt the  
 nephew the other and  
 surviving legatees named  
 in the will of the said  
 George Mordaunt deceased  
 having first proved the said  
 will.

I desire that five Executors may be given to my  
 Executor John Mordaunt for a King Henry  
 Mordaunt signed in the presence of us George  
 Shepherd J. M. Hogarth

**This Will** was proved at London  
 with a codicil on the twentieth day of May in  
 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
 and fifty before the Reverend Charles  
 Spote Doctor of Laws and Surrogate of the Right  
 Honorable Sir John Drieholl Knight also a  
 Doctor of Laws Quaker Juror or Comptroller  
 of the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully  
 constituted by the Oath of George Mordaunt in  
 Esquire the Brother of the deceased and one of  
 the Executors named in the said will to whom  
 administration was granted of all and singular  
 the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased  
 he having been first sworn duly to administer  
 power reserved of making the like grant to  
 George Mordaunt the younger and John Mordaunt  
 the nephews of the said deceased and their or  
 either of them shall apply for the same.

**Frances Maria Murray** In the Name of God Amen  
 I Frances Maria Murray Spinster living in the  
 parish of Saint George in the County of London  
 do make this my last will and testament in a  
 manner following that is to say I desire all my  
 just and lawful debts to be paid and I desire to  
 be decently and privately buried in the vault  
 in Grosvenor Chapel South Audley Street and  
 this I have in charge of my Executors here  
 mentioned Charles Grant Esquire of Dean  
 House Simpson Esquire and Charles  
 Sumner Esquire Solicitor at Charing Cross  
 I bequeath to each of these Gentlemen my  
 Executors the sum of one hundred pounds for  
 each I have and bequeath to Lady Elizabeth  
 Murray sister to the late Earl of Sumner  
 residing in the abbey at Edinburgh the sum  
 of two hundred pounds I have and bequeath  
 to the Duchess of Athol the Ornamental China  
 upon the chimney piece in each drawing room  
 the blue and white China cabinet and the  
 writing stand in under glass upon the table.
