 London the sum of one hundred pounds I give and bequeath unto
Mary Ann Sulca daughter of the said *John Duxmaster* the sum of one
 hundred pounds I give and bequeath unto *Thomas Everill* of *St. Pauls* now
 a Gentleman nineteen pounds nineteen shillings I give and bequeath
 unto *William Percy* of *Hyde Street* *Bloomsbury* in the said County of *Middle-*
 sex Gentleman the sum of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings and as to all
 the rest residue and remainder of my property estate and effects whatso-
 ever consisting of book debts money securities for money or stock in any of the public
 funds or of what nature the same may consist including any property over
 which I may have a power to dispose by will or otherwise I give and be-
 queath the same unto my said brother *Matthew Mason* and the said
Mason daughter of the said *Matthew Mason* share and share alike and in
 the event of the death of either the said *Matthew Mason* or *Lary Mason* the
 survivor to receive the whole and in the event of both dying then the survivor
 of my said brother *Matthew Mason*'s family to take the whole share and
 share alike and I do hereby nominate and appoint my said brother *Matthew*
Mason and the said *Thomas Everill* and *William Percy* to be the Executors of
 this my will and in case of the death of either of them in my lifetime I do hereby
 appoint my said sister *Lary Mason* to be Executor and to act with the
 survivor or survivor and I declare this to be my last will and Testament and
 King hereby all other and former wills by me at any time heretofore made
 in witness whereof I have to this my last will and Testament and to a dupli-
 cate thereof caused to be written on three pages of paper set my hand and seal as
 follows to the first two pages I have set my hand and seal and to the third and last
 page I have set my hand and seal this twentieth day of April
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine

Proved at London the 14th July 1842 before the worshipful *Jos. Abbott* Justice
 of Laws and Surrogate by the Oaths of *Matthew Mason* the brother and
William Percy two of the Executors named in the will and *Lary Mason* of the
 said *Thomas* the Executor substituted therein because *Thomas* was granted a
 bene fidei propra doli to administer - *Thomas Everill* the other Executor named
 in the said will having died in the Testator's lifetime.

of the Charles Henry Martyn Esquire of King Street Greenwiche in the County of Kent Gentleman I desire that all my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses may be paid as soon after my decease as may be due to the rest residue and remainder of my Estate of whatsoever kind it may be I give devise and bequeath to my three brothers John James Martyn Edward Parry Martyn and William Fearnall Martyn in equal proportions share and share alike to be paid to them on their respective attaining the age of twenty one years and in case either of my said brothers should die before attaining the age of twenty one years then it is my Will that the share of the said brother so dying should be divided between the survivor or survivors share and share alike and I hereby appoint my Cousins Richard Smith Esquire of George Street Greenwiche and Henry Turner Esquire of Dartmouth Terrace Dartmouth both in the County of Kent as Executors of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine - Charles Henry Martyn Esq - Signed sealed published and declared as and for the last Will and Testament of the Testator in the presence of us who at his request and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names - John L. John Carttar of King Street in Greenwiche in the County of Kent Esquire Ann Carttar (wife of the said John Carttar) of the same place and Henry Turner Latham of Dartmouth Terrace Dartmouth in the County of Kent Esquire and made Oath and first the said John Carttar for himself made Oath that he is one of the subscribed witnesses to the last Will and Testament hereunto annexed of the said Charles Henry Martyn late of King Street Greenwiche aforesaid Gentleman deceased and with reference to the blank appearing on the said Will for the date of the execution thereof he saith that he attended the said deceased with his fellow Appraiser the said Ann Carttar at the house in King Street aforesaid in which he was then residing for the purpose of witnessing the execution of his Will in the month of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine though on the said day of the said month the Appraiser cannot now recollect and the Appraiser further saith that from a certain memorandum now in his possession of his having advanced the deceased a sum of money on the fourteenth day of the said month of October to enable him to go to Hastings where he was then at home on account of his health and from the circumstances that the Appraiser will recollect that the said Will was executed by the said Testator a few days only before he so went to Hastings he is enabled to state and saith that the said Will was executed by the said Testator Charles Henry Martyn by his signing his name thereto in the presence of the Appraiser and of his fellow witness the said Ann Carttar both of whom were then present together and who as soon as the said Will was so signed set and subscribed their names as witnesses thereto in the presence of the said Testator and of each other on a day of the said month of
