My further will, and meaning is, that if my wife be with child, and shall be
safely delivered thereof, and the child liveth, that the said child shall have his
lively hood, maintenance, and breeding together with my wife, and my other children ex-
pressively mentioned in my will, untill the said child shall attain the age of one and twenty
years, the said maintenance to be raised out of my goods, and chattels, And I doo
give unto my said child the sum of twenty poundes to be put out for the best
profit, and advantage of the said child, by my within named overseers within six
months after the birth of the said child, if it shall then live, and to be so
continued untill the said child shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years
in witness whereof I have hereto sett my hand the day and yeare first above written

This Will and Codrill above written was proved at London before the right
Worshipfull Sir Nathaniel Bacon, Kn: Doctor of Lawes, ma: of the Right
of the Honourable Court. The signeth day of December in the yeare of our Lord
God one thousand six hundred fiftie and six by the oath of Elizabeth Ogates the Relict of
the said deceased, and sole executrix named in the said will. To whom was committed adran of
all and singular the goods, chattels, and debts of the said deceased. Who being first severally
sworne by oaths of a Commissioner (issued forth) faithfully to administer the same.

In the name of God Amen Thomas
Ogates of Bradford in the County of Wilts Sheriff be my uncle
of body, but thank be unto God of good and perfect memory, doe thus ordaine my last will
and testament in forme and manner following, vizt I comend my soule into the hands of my
Creator, and my body to be interred within the parish Church of Bradford, And as for
my worldly estate, I give and bequeath in forme and manner followinge. Item I give unto
the Cathedrall Church of Sarum twelve poundes. Item the land which John Oborne gent deceased
gave is to remaine unto my eldest Sonne John Yerbury, and fourty poundes to be paid him
by my executor as it may conveniently be made, out of my said estate. Also I give all the yeares
in two classes of pasture, and meadows within the parish of Hoochewell within the
County of Somersset, under the tenent, and Covenants therein mentioned of the devise
and grant of Edmund Lovelocke Esq: deceased to be and remaine solely to him, and his
heire forever. Also I give him my best and my maid, and his
wife the whole term of yeares unexpired. Also I give him my best and my maid, and his
my second Sonne, my two Coppied holdes estates, vizt one of the Deane and Chapter lands of
Gifford, and the other which I purchased of Sir William Liller Kn: deceased for his life
according to the Custome of the said Manors, and fourty poundes to be paid him by
my executor, as it may conveniently be made, out of my said estate, which money was given
him by his grand father John Oborne gent deceased of Hoochewell, and my best bull and my
best in my chamber, and my Capite, with Belt and cratch. Item I give unto my third Sonne
William Yerbury all my right, and interest in my livinge at Crombe within the parish of
Bradford which I holdeth by the devise and grant of Sir Thomas Fairfax Kn: deceased
under the tenent, and Covenants therein expressed, whom I constitute, and ordaine to be sole
Executor of this my last will, and testament and my will is all my debts to be paid first out of my
estate to my own several Executors, Executors, and hundred and ten poundes, and other
debts

debts about fiftie poundes or more. Lastly I did desire my trustie and well beloved friend
 Paul Methwin went, Mr Robert Scollon, and my brother in law Mr Robert Smith
 of Hroome to be aiding and assisting to my executor, whom I did appointe and
 desire to be my executor of this my last will and testament, which will is to give to each
 one of my overseers twenty shillings a peece to execute and of them I published this to be
 my last will and testament the fourth daie of January 1630. Thomas Overburd. Witness
 hereunto John Faulkner his mark. Daniel Corant his mark.

The thirtie daie of December in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred
 and thirtie. At Donnington issued forth to Robert Smith the brother in law, and one
 of the Overseers named in the last will and testament of Thomas Overburd
 late of Hroome in the countie of Wiltes deceased havinge under his hand and
 signe thattelle, and debts accordant to the tenor and effect of the said will due unto the executor
 of William Overburd the said and executor within named and to his wife and beholfe. Soe
 the said Robert Smith be my selfe lawfully sworn faithfully to administer the said

 is due to mee, desiringe him also to performe what is hereafter expressed in writinge
 And I doe give unto my deare Aunt Mrs. Margaret Mordant my Ruby Ring, and
 a white Dresse, and to my deare Aunt Mrs. Elizabeth Tyringham of Oxenford, and
 to my deare wife Mrs. Lewis Mordant a white Ring, and to my wife Mrs. Richard
 Rapier a white ring, and to my my cogen Mrs. Ann Gason five pound, and to my daughter
 Mrs. Elizabeth Gason my silver spoone, and to my goddaughter Mrs. Dorothy Shubnall
 three poundes, and to my godson John Shulton ten shillings, and to my goddaughter Elizabeth
 Eyde twenty shillings, and to my mayde hande Thorton thirtie shillings over and above
 her wages, and for my vnde good friend Mrs. Eli. foure ten pound, and to Tom Hicke
 for his shillings, and for my mourninge apparell I desire my Aunt Mrs. Eli. Tyringham
 may have the disposinge of it, and lastly I desire my deare wife Mrs. Tyringham Esq.
 whom I make my sole executor of this my last will and testament to see mee decently buried
 in a wite whereof I sett my hand and seale the twentieth someth of October 1631 Thomas
 Mordant. Witness hereunto and delivered in the presence of J. Tyringham Elizabeth Anne.

This will abovescriben was proved at London before William Turner Doctor of
 Lawe, Surrogate of the right worshipfull Sir Nathaniell Brent kt. also doctor
 of Lawe, Maor keeper of the successorie Court. The tenth daie of December in the year
 of our Lord God one thousand six hundred thirtie and by the oath of William Tyringham the
 sole Executor therein named to whom was committed administration of all and singular the goods
 thattelle and debts of the said deceased. Soe beinge lawfully sworn faithfully to adm. the same.

Memorandum That the right worshipfull Thomas Eden
 Doctor of Lawe late deceased, did in the time of his life, whereof hee dyed, and especially in or

 to add unto his last will) declare his will and minde to be as followeth, vizt. Soe
