 liberty of the Tower of London Gentleman and Charles Master
 of the parish of St. Mary Staining London Gent. do jointly and
 severally make oath that they best deponents severally know
 and were well acquainted with the said Elizabeth Master late of
 the parish of Ebbwre in the County of Shetford widow deceased and
 with her manner and Character of hand writing having often
 seen her write and they these deponents now reviewing the paper
 writing her wunts annexed marked (a) containing and being the
 last will and Testament of the said deceased beginning thus [In
 the name of God amen I Elizabeth Master of the parish of
 this my last will and Testament] and ending thus [In witness
 to this my last will I set my hand this 29th day of April 1720.] and
 subscribed thus (Elizabeth Master) do severally make oath that they
 verily in their Consciences believe that the said will and the name
 Elizabeth Master subscribed at the foot or bottom thereof as aforesd.
 was and is totally wrote and signed by and with the proper hand
 of her the said deceased James Adenshaw Cha. Master. 26.

Willie that the said Settlement be fully executed according to the true
import and meaning thereof leaving the Education of my two Children
by the said Elizabeth Widdaunt formerly Doyle Sophia Elizabeth -
and Anna Maria Widdaunt to my present dear wife Elizabeth -
Widdaunt formerly Collier to whom for her constant good temper
Care of me and uniform behaviour blameless in all points I have
Obligations beyond expressing allowing the Interest of the said
Thousand pounds to my said dear wife for the Education of the -
said Sophia Elizabeth and Anna Maria Widdaunt till out of age and
such sums become payable to them or their respective future husbands
their Executors or assigns and this without account but because I
am sensible that they may leave her young and in such indifferent
Circumstances that it may be for the advantage of her self -
and Children to remarry then it is my will the Education of
the said Sophia Elizabeth and Anna Maria fall to the persons
who are Trustees in the above named Settlement or their next
representatives with the above allowance unless the said -
Trustees or their Representatives or one of them desire to
continue their Education on the above mentioned Terms and my
said wife think proper to accept the same which she will oblige me
in doing and they in desiring or proposing an entire confidence
in her and to be by a Settlement before my interim marriage
with the said Elizabeth Collier I made ample Settlement upon
the Children of my deceased wife and my present wife and her
Children which are absolutely impossible to perform by Mr. Scot
Alexander Smale failing in his Contract I advise and give all
the residue of my Estate both real and personal (the above
mentioned thousand pounds first deducted) to my present wife
during her natural life for her maintenance and the Education
of her Children by me born or to be born and after her
decease to the Children equally to be divided between them
and the survivor of them at her decease ordering and empower-
ing my said present wife to sell as soon as conveniently may
be my Cottage Farm Situate and lying in little Paxton and
Southor in Count Downington and my dwelling house in little
Paxton aforesaid Gardens Outhouses and all the lands -
belonging thereto which are freeholds or supposed to be so -
resolving the money arising from the said sale to the use
above mentioned all my just debts first discharged and of
this my last will and Testament I constitute and appoint my
said present wife Elizabeth Widdaunt formerly Collier sole
Executrix In witness whereof I have to each page of these
presentes set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of September
one thousand seven hundred twenty six O: Widdaunt

 of the Faith anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and
 Twenty and seven I Joseph Norman of Stoke Newington
 in the County of Middlesex Gentleman being in good health of body
 and of sound and perfect mind and memory thank be given to a
 almighty God for the same but calling to mind the uncertainty of
 of this present life do therefore make and ordain this my last will
 and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first
 and principally I do recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
 God my Creator trusting to be saved by and through the merits
 of Jesus Christ my Redeemer for my body I do commit to the earth
 decently to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter
 after mentioned and named and for my worldly Goods and
 Estate I do dispose of in manner and form following viz. To Norman
 Wreath Clerk the sum of one hundred pounds Item to Susannah
 Norman of Bradham Widow the sum of five pounds Item to Anne
 Wreath Widow the sum of five pounds Item to Mary Anne
 Sarah and Catherine Daughters of the said Anne Wreath the sum
 of five pounds each Item to Isabella Daughter of the said Anne
 Wreath the sum of twenty pounds Item to Elizabeth Daughter of
 William and Elizabeth Edrige the sum of thirty pounds to be
 paid her by my Executors when she shall arrive to the age of
 eighteen years with Interest for the same and likewise Interest
 for the said Interest my mind and will is that the above named
 Norman Wreath shall be in Trust to see the same performed But
 if in case the said Elizabeth Edridge should dye before she arrive
 to the age of eighteen years the above mentioned thirty pounds
 with Interest as before mentioned shall be paid to Elizabeth
 Edrige her Mother for her own proper use and behoof and if the
 said Mother should likewise dye before the said eighteen years
 should be expired the said thirty pounds with Interest shall
 return equally and share alike to my Executors Item to Susanna
 Perry widow the sum of five pounds Item to Margaret the
 Daughter of Edward Norman the sum of ten pounds Item to
 Margaret the Daughter of William and Mary Clark the sum
 of ten shillings Item to Samuel Altom the sum of fifty shillings
 Item to Samuel Altom the younger the sum of five pounds
