as beds bedding Linen woollen Chests of Drawers Tables Chairs and other
furniture of household and household goods whatsoever that shall be in my dwelling
house at Islington aforesaid at the time of my death Item I give unto my said
Wife Threestore pounds to buy mourning for her self and sure of her family
as she shall think fit and I give the like sume of threestore pounds unto my
son John Wordant Esq[ui]r to buy mourning for himself his wife and Daughter
and sure others of his family as he shall think fit Item I give and bequeath
all my messuages Tenements buildings and Erections in the parish of St.
Bamond Clerkenwell in the said County of Middlesex and elsewhere
with their appurtenances and all my tenements and terms of years
and time therein and also all my goods Chattels ready money and personal
estate whatsoever and whatsoever (other than the ornaments and things
given to my wife as aforesaid and the said bequest for mourning) unto my
said wife and son their Executors and Administrators equally to be divided
between them share and share alike subject nevertheless to the payment
of my Debts and funeral Expenses and I will and declare that what is
hereby given to my said son John shall be in full satisfaction of all Claims
and Demands that he may have out of my Estate by virtue of any debt
or Bond or otherwise for any debt and lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my
said wife and son joint Executors of this my last will and Testament
Written upon one sheet of paper I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
fifth day of September in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred
twenty and three and the tenth year of his Majesty George by the Grace of
God King of Great Brittain &c. J. Wordant. Signed sealed published
and declared by St. John Wordant the Testator as and to be his last will
and Testament in the presence of us Rob. Southam Eliz. Southam
Grace Bidout.

this my last will and Testament in manner and form following first
and principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hope
through the merits of my dear saviour to obtaine forgiveness of all my sins
and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently interred according to the
direction of my Executor hereinafter named and as for such worldly
goods it has pleased God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof
as followeth I give and bequeath unto Mary Stagg Daughter
of John Stagg of the City of London house Carpenter the sum of ten
pounds to be paid to her by my Executor when she shall attain to the
age of eighteen years but in case the said Mary Stagg should not
live to the said age of eighteen years then I give the said legacy of ten
pounds to my wife Jane Willward her Executor Administrator or
Assignee whom I give unto my brother in law John Platt potmaher all
my wearing apparell being docten to be delivered to him within one
month after my decease Item I give and bequeath unto Mr. John
Thurston of the City of Bristol one Quinta or a Tenth of my goods
Item all the rest and residue of my goods plate jewels household stuff
money and all other my personall Estate whatso ever and wheresoever
I give and bequeath unto my said wife Jane Willward whom I do
make full and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby
revoaking all former wills by me made and I do make my said brother in
law John Platt Overseer of this my will desiring him to be assistant
to my Executor in the Execution thereof In witness whereof I the said
William Willward have to this my last will and Testament sett my hand
and Seal this fiftiday of May Anno Domini 1723. W. Willward
Signed sealed published and declared by the Testator himself in the
presence of us whose names are subscribed as Witnesses and attested
by us in the presence of the said Testator Thomas Leane W. Willward
