In the name of God Amen; the xxijth daie of August
 in the vijth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King James the first
 of Peter Miller of Stoke Newington in the County of Suff^{re} yeoman, being in
 body but of good and perfect memory (praised be God) doe make & ordeine this my last will
 & testament in manner & followinge First and principally I bequeath my soule into the
 hand of Almighty God steadfastly believing by the onely meritt of Iesus Christ my
 onely Saviour & mercifull Redeemer to obtaine free pardon & forgiveness of all my
 sinnes & my body to be buried in Christian buriall at the discretion of my Executor and
 supervisor hereafter in this wille named And as touching such worldly estate
 as it hath pleased God to lend me in this life, I will give & dispose of the same as
 followeth First I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my lovinge wife all my good &
 chasteable debte & debts of household of what nature or qualite becoming
 my debte and payinge unto Mr. Symon Dawson of Stoke aforesaid the summe of
 ten shillings to be payde by my executor upon the daye of my buriall and suffi-
 ringe Iacob my sonne to have and enjoy the one halfe of all my household stuffe
 at his full age of xxijth yeares to be sold & disposed of the same at his pleasure And
 I ordeine and make the said Elizabeth my wife my sole and onely executrix of this
 my last will and testament And I doe earnestly entreate my lovinge friend Matthew
 Smith of Hadleigh in the said County of Suff^{re} Notary publicke & supervisor of this
 my last will & testament to be my executor & assessor unto my said executrix in the perfor-
 mance of this my will And I give him for a remembrance of this kinde of his duty al-
 wayes shewed unto me & mine & for his payme to be taken hereafter the summe of good
 English money to be payde within one month next after my decease In witness whereof
 I have hereunto sett my hand and seale the daye & yeare aforesaid Peter Miller & his
 will & seale sealed & published & declared as my last will & testament in the presence of
 William Adon, John James and Symon Dawson of Stoke. And that the bequest of the
 shillings to Susan Mordaunt and twenty shillings a yeare to John Miller of Stoke
 shillings were payed out by the appointment of the said Peter Miller. William
 Adon, John James, Symon Dawson, John T. James, John Miller, Symon Dawson, John Miller.

 late wife of Henry Mordaunt of Chymdenly in the County of Suff^{re} being
 of perfect mynd and memory humbly be given to god almighty the reason
 of knowinge the danger of sickness & sodaine death I ordeine this my last
 will and testament as followeth First I bequeath my soule to god my Creator
 and to Iesus Christ my Redeemer through the meritt of his hope to be saved and
 to the holy gost my sanctifier these persons and one exhorting god and my body
 I bequeath to the earth from whence it came, to be buried in Christian
 buriall And as touching my temporall goods I will give in this manner I give
 becoming upon me I give them in this manner followinge I give unto
 my eldest sonne Henry Mordaunt forty shillings to buy him a ringe, I give
 unto my wife Susan Mordaunt forty shillings to buy her a ringe, I give
 unto Barbara Mordaunt

His wife my Diamond ring with the left with her when I came from Chymderlyng
 I gave unto my son the said Mordant the said Shillinge to buy him a ring having
 assigned him his portion by my last will and testament I give unto my son in lawe Thomas
 Duke of Walsden the said Mordant to buy him a ring I am my will meaning is that
 my son Charles Mordant shall be sole Executor of this my last will and testa-
 ment whiche I acknowledge to be my last will and by revoking all former made
 And my will is that my son Charles Mordant shall have the benefit and quiet
 possession of what soever I have ben bequeathed either goods chattels or any
 other thinge what soever And that he may securely enjoye it, & request and
 charge all the rest of my children that they gonot about to overtake this
 my last will and Testament by them selves or any other by their procurement
 or instigation or disturb my Executor of what he should possesse and enjoye by
 virtue of this my last will and Testament, and if they shall any way attempt
 or goe about it, they shall not onely lose their legacies by this my last will given
 them but also what formerly by my wife I have given them and that shall
 come contrary to my Executor And this I have remembred my other children
 by my life I have also now also at my death disposed of the remainder
 and I hope I have discharged the trust reposed in me by my well beloved and
 late deceased husband Henry Mordant, Desiring god almighty of his goodnes to
 bless all my children and make them thorough his grace his faithful ser-
 vants And in witness that this is my last will and Testament hereby revoking
 all other wills and Testaments what soever I have put to my hand and seal the
 29th October Anno Domini 1622 Susan Mordant Sealed and acknowledged in the

 which place I have in Kings Lym aforesaid twenty Shillinge I give to
 the said Myles my eldest daughter forty pounde of lawfull money of England to
 be paid to him one year next after my decease I give to my daughter
 which place London ten pounde of like money to be paid to him two
 monthes next after my decease I give to my son the said Myles twenty pounde
 of like money and to every one of the residue of my children forty pounde a part
 of like money to be paid to them one month next after their severall age of one
 and twenty years, and I will that the moneys givene the first in the name
 of them shall be towards the charge of their severall maintenance and education And
 due to be severally paid unto them that the first and portons and the second
